Conference Description:

Within recent years there has been a great emphasis placed on the ways society views and talks about their generational differences. The field of psychology is not immune to those generational dynamics, especially as it relates to dynamics within groups. It is time that therapists view the ways that intergenerational dynamics appear in group spaces if we are to help society navigate the cultural changes that are happening today.

Dr. Shemika Brooks and Dr. Jacky Darby have created for MAGPS an annual Spring conference that will focus our attention on ageism and generational differences in group therapy. Through various activities (i.e., presentations, small discussion groups, question and answer sessions, and experiential small group sessions) attendees will explore how these issues impact group work. We will look at generational categories and how they show up in groups; identifying generational spaces and how intersectional identities appear in those spaces, including in our own small groups; Identifying ageism and how to manage it, as well as how sociological, cultural, and political dynamics influence those generational spaces.

Learning Objectives

1. Participants will be able to differentiate five different generational categories that may be seen in group dynamics.
2. Participants will be able to define ageism and recognize its bidirectional impact in the group context.
3. Participants will be able to identify how intersectionality appears within intergenerational spaces.
4. Participants will be able to describe three potential intergenerational conflicts that can arise in group dynamics.
5. Participants will be able to identify two intergenerational dynamics within large group spaces.
6. Participants will be able to assess the impact of intergenerational dynamics within relationships of client-group, co-facilitators, and/or supervisor-supervisee
